The panel discussion was divided into three phases. The discussion was opened by the faculty forum coordinator Dr Vipul Solanki. Then the panellists started the discussion by their opening remarks for three minutes each. The opening remarks were followed by construction, deconstruction and reconstruction of arguments.



In the subsequent discussion, some of the issues like designing syllabus and tasks for TBLT, its implementation in our current system and, importantly, the evaluations of the students' performance were discussed rigorously.

After the brainstorming, the house was left open to the attendees for their questions and queries. Many faculties asked questions and the panellists responded in the best possible ways. Some of the arguments constructed by the panellists were challenged whereas others were bettered. A very good churning of ideas took place in the Q&A session.







Last but not least, the session was concluded by Dr Sunil Sagar's stimulating remarks. He synthesized the ideas by saying that not only TBLT but even any other approach or method is not sufficient in itself to teach a language. For better language teaching, a teacher should always try to see the best use of a blend of various approaches or methods.
